Albany, NY – Judy Meier of the Mount Vernon-Yonkers Elks Lodge # 707 will be honored by Cerebral Palsy Associations of New York State at the organization's Annual Awards Banquet, Monday October 24 at the Saratoga City Center in Saratoga Springs. The Awards Banquet is part of the CP of NYS Annual Conference, which will bring hundreds of people from across the state to Albany October 25-27.

Judith Ramos Meier is a Licensed Representative and the owner of a firm specializing in representing injured workers. She is the first female Past Exalted Ruler of Elks Lodge #707 and presently serves as the South District Major Project Chair. She is a member of Women's Inc. and a past member of the coaching staff of the Bryn Mawr Boys and Girls Club.

Meier is a former chairwoman and one of the founding members of the Hispanic Democrats of Westchester, an organization dedicated to advocating for the rights of Hispanics and their political, economic and educational interests.

Judith and Thomas Meier have been married for 30 years. He is a retired Army Colonel and has served the Elks in many capacities. Together they have worked to create awareness and raise funds to support the CP of NYS Home Service program and local programs and events conducted for CP Westchester.
