

CP of NYS, Affiliates Produce Art Display in Manhattan

Queens Centers for Progress (QCP), United Cerebral Palsy of New York City (UCP/NYC) and Cerebral Palsy Associations of New York State-Metro Services have combined to produce a display of art work created by consumers of the three agencies at the Port Authority Bus Terminal in Manhattan. More than 30 works of art by people with disabilities will be on display at the facility on 8th Avenue and 41st Street until March 27th.



This display features artwork by more than two dozen people with disabilities representing QCP, UCP/NYC and CP of NYS-Metro Services. This is the first collaborative art display involving CP of NYS Affiliates and has already drawn numerous inquiries about the organizations and their programs by commuters and other people using the Port Authority Bus Terminal.



The display is in the main hallway near the 9th Avenue side of the Port Authority Terminal and is available for viewing during all hours of operation.
